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






THE BEGINGING OF THE BOURKE SHOW

28 Sept & Oct 1 1872

Meeting held, the formation of the Central Australian Pastoral & Agricultural Association was formed. Mr Becker placed at the disposal of the Institution 10 acres of land near the river, fenced in, close to the town. Officers and Committee appointed and decided that the first show should be held as soon as practicable.



17 June 1873

First AGM held. A Code of Rules was adopted. Annual Show to be in May of each year, the date to be set at the Annual Meetings. The first Show will be in 1874.


First 2 day Show held. Mr Scrymgour is Secretary. The Association is combined with Brewarrina Pastoral Association, the arrangement that annual Shows will take place alternately at Bourke and Brewarrina.

Gold and Silver Goblets and Cups were substituted by the Committee for the Gold and Silver Medals originally advertised. Sections included Wool, Sheep, Cattle, Horses, Working Bullocks and Buggy Horses.

The Central Australian Pastoral Association Show.

THF first show of this association was held at Bourke on Monday and Tuesday, this week. The weather was magnificent, and everything propitious, with the exception of the fire at Tattersall's hotel on the previous Sunday, which had disturbed the visitors and given rise to some inconveniences. This association is combined with the Brewarrina Pastoral Association. the arrangement being that annual shows shall take place alternately at Bourke and Brewarrina, and that both a ssociations shall do their best to support one another. The show was in every way much better than the most sanguine ever expected. The exhibits were numerous and the attendance large, and we are informed by competent judges that the exhibits were highly creditable to the district. The list of exhibits and prize-takers, with the remarks of the judges, which we subjoin, speaks for itself. The prizes (which will be distributed as soon as possible) consist of handsome silver goblets and cups, substituted by the committee for the gold and silver medals originally advertised. During Monday afternoon much interest was excited by the handsome appearance of Mr. J. Becker's Shetland entire Bijou, which was exhibited, but did not come within any of the prize classes. It was a matter for regret that Dr. Grant's pair of chestnuts did not arrive on the ground until a few minutes after the prize was awarded for the buggy horses, and thus had no chance to take honors. During Tuesday morning Mr. Scrymgour, the Secretary sold some of the prize stock by public auction, as follows: Fat bullock, £18; a fat cow, £19 10s; champion merino ram 14 guineas; 3 merine rams for 35 guineas; 3 merino rams for 38 guineas, and 5 merino ewes for 10 guineas. Some sales were also effected by Mr. E. J. Bloxham.

The exhibitor must have entries in all three junior sections - Junior Cooking, Junior Photography, and Junior Work. A small plaque will be awarded each year to the winner. This award can be won a maximum of 3 times in consecutive shows by any one competitor.

LD Davis Memorial Perpetual Trophy will be presented to the Most Successful Exhibitor in the Pavilion. The exhibitor must have entries in at least three sections. A small plaque will be awarded each year to the winner. This award can be won a maximum of 3 times in consecutive shows by any one competitor.

Points are issued as follows: 1st: 3 points, 2nd: 2 points, 3rd: 1 point.

Gwen Brown Memorial Shield donated by Cathy Simpson for the exhibitor who has the most entries in the 2024 Pavilion. This shield is a perpetual prize. A small plaque will be awarded each year to the winner.

PAVILION EXHIBITORS' REGULATIONS

- Exhibits will be accepted at the showground pavilion between 8am and 11am
 Friday 31st May. No entries will be accepted after 11am.
- Entries will not be accepted without payment of 50c per entry.
- All Fine Art, Craft, Needlecraft, Yarncraft, Photography, Cooking, Jams & Preserves and Floral Arrangement exhibits must be the bone fide work of the exhibitor. All Flowers, Potted Plants and Produce must be grown by the exhibitor.
- All Junior Work exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor. All junior entries must have the entrant's age on each entry tag.
- In the event of there being only one entry in any class, the awarding of 1st place will be at the discretion of the judge and steward.

- No persons other than officials will be allowed in the Pavilion while judging is taking place.
- While all due care will be taken with exhibits, the Association will not, in any
 circumstances, be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits. Exhibits
 are entered solely at the risk of the exhibitor.
- Exhibits must be collected between 4-5pm on Saturday evening. All exhibits being collected must be signed for by the exhibitor or an authorised representative.
- Uncollected items can be collected from Boure Public Library from Monday 3rd June.
- Prizes to be awarded are: First \$2 and Ribbon, Second \$1 and Ribbon, Third 50c and Ribbon.
- All prizemoney must be claimed on the day of the Show. Prize money is to be collected from the office between 10am and 5pm, 1st June, 2024. Any monies not collected during these hours will be forfeited.
- All perpetual trophies will be retained by the Association after presentation.

- 5. Once the fleece is judged the value of the fleece becomes the nomination
- 6. All fleeces to be judged on the following points: (Maximum points in brackets)
 Trueness to Type (10), Length (10), Soundness (10), Colour (6), Character (10), Softness (8), Density (6), Evenness (10), Top and Noil (30). TOTAL 100.

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
