The pavilion will be open from 9:30am-3:30pm on Saturday 9th May.

Junior Perpetual Trophy donated by Barbara Davis will be presented to the Most Successful Junior Exhibitor in the Pavilion. The exhibitor must have entries in at least three junior sections. A small plaque will be awarded each year to the winner. This award can be won a maximum of 3 times in consecutive shows by any one competitor.

LD Davis Memorial Perpetual Trophy will be presented to the Most Successful Exhibitor in the Pavilion. The exhibitor must have entries in at least three sections. A small plaque will be awarded each year to the winner. This award can be won a maximum of 3 times in consecutive shows by any one competitor.

Points are issued as follows: 1st: 3 points, 2nd: 2 points, 3rd: 1 point.

Gwen Brown Memorial Shield donated by Cathy Simpson for the exhibitor who has the most entries in the Pavilion. This shield is a perpetual prize. A small plaque will be awarded each year to the winner.

PAVILION EXHIBITORS' REGULATIONS

- Exhibits for all sections other than photography will be accepted at the showground pavilion between 8am and 11am Friday 8th May. No entries will be accepted after 11am. See Section 9 for information on entering in the photography section.
- Entries will not be accepted without payment of \$1 per entry.
- All Fine Art, Craft, Needlecraft, Yarncraft, Photography, Cooking, Jams & Preserves and Floral Arrangement exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor. All Flowers, Potted Plants and Produce must be grown by the exhibitor.
- All Junior Work exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor. All junior entries must have the entrant's age on each entry tag.
- In the event of there being only one entry in any class, the awarding of 1st place will be at the discretion of the judge and steward.
- No persons other than officials will be allowed in the Pavilion while judging is taking place.
- While all due care will be taken with exhibits, the Association will not, in any circumstances, be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits. Exhibits are entered solely at the risk of the exhibitor.
- All exhibits must be collected between 4:30-5:30pm on Saturday evening. All exhibits being collected must be signed for by the exhibitor or an authorised representative. If you are unable to collect your exhibits, you must make arrangements with the Pavilion Chief Steward to collect them at a later date.
- Prizes to be awarded are: First \$3 and Ribbon, Second \$2 and Ribbon, Third \$1 and Ribbon.
- All prizemoney must be claimed on the day of the Show. Prize money is to be collected from the office between 10am and 5pm, Saturday 9th May, 2026. Any monies not collected during these hours will be forfeited.
- All perpetual trophies will be retained by the Association after presentation.
- Exhibitors, please note special conditions at the start of each section.

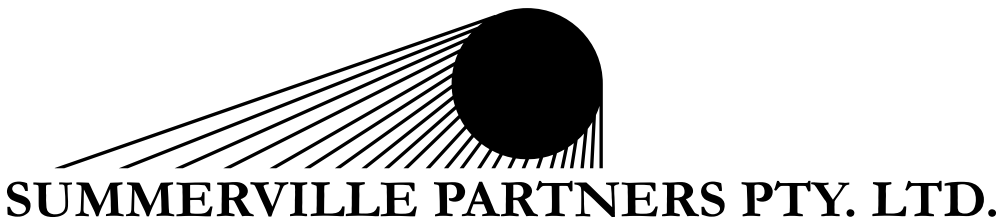

Agenda and Procedure

Competitors will be requested to do the following procedures:

Freestyle - Each competitor has 45 seconds (Under 12yrs 25 seconds; 12 & Under 16yrs 35 seconds) to perform a routine and/or display their skills. Anything goes.

Stationary Target (1) - Competitors must strike 3 stationary targets (cans).
One go at each can only.

Stationary Target (2) - This will require competitors to cut paper targets from a "T" framed stand which will have a target at each end of the horizontal bar (2 metres apart) and a third vertical target in the centre. The horizontal targets will be at a height of 1 metre. Competitors have two goes at each target. More points are awarded when there is an audible whip crack sound when striking target.

POINT SYSTEM AS FOLLOWS:

Appearance: Competitor should present themselves and their whips to judges.
Points max. 10.

Style: Looking for confidence, well rehearsed routine. Points max. 10.

Performance: Competitors should be able to show their ability to competently crack a whip in both single and multiple cracking from either hand. Points max. 10.

Accuracy: Ability to successfully hit several targets, best points for cracking whip before hitting target. Points max. 10.

Originality: Looking for uniqueness in cracking style and performance. Points max. 10.
The starting line will be seven feet from the target. One bonus point will be given for a seven foot whip and two bonus points for an eight foot whip.

1. Exhibitors must own the sheep from which the wool is taken and be predominantly grown in the Western Division.
2. Fleeces must be skirted to the industry code of practice. Any fleeces not skirted to these standards will not be judged.
3. Not more than 12 months growth. The P & A Association have been advised by the wool brokers that the industry regards wools in excess of 110mm as being excessive in length. Therefore, fleeces exceeding this length will be classed as excessively grown and judged accordingly.
4. Fleeces to be at showground by 10am on Friday prior to showday
5. Once the fleece is judged the value of the fleece becomes the nomination
6. All fleeces to be judged on the following points: (Maximum points in brackets)-
Trueness to Type (10), Length (10), Soundness (10), Colour (6), Character (10), Softness (8), Density (6), Evenness (10), Top and Noil (30). TOTAL 100.
7. Grand Champion Fleece and Best Commercial Fleece will be sent to the RAS Show.

Class 1 – Fine Wool Fleece

Class 2 – Medium/Strong Fleece

BLACK SOIL

Class 3 – Fine Wool Fleece

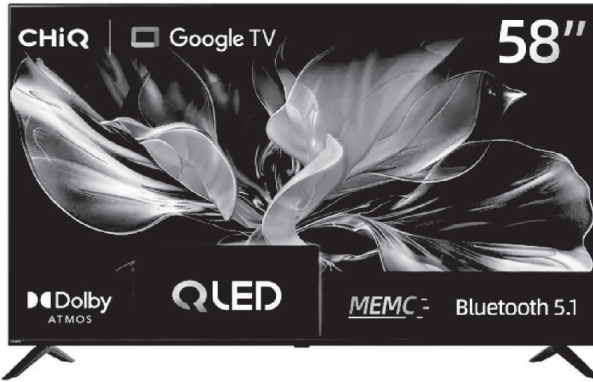

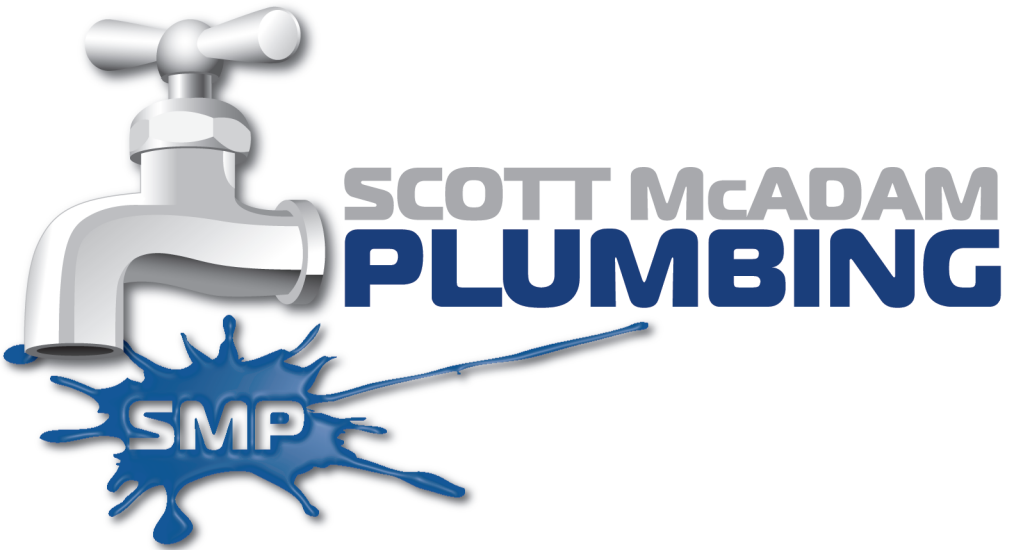

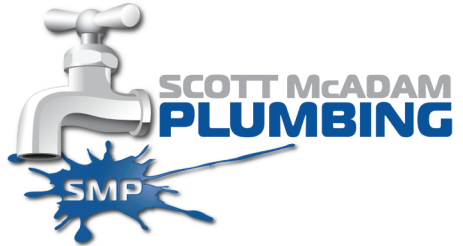
